Figure 1. Export of Goods and Services during Jul-Dec

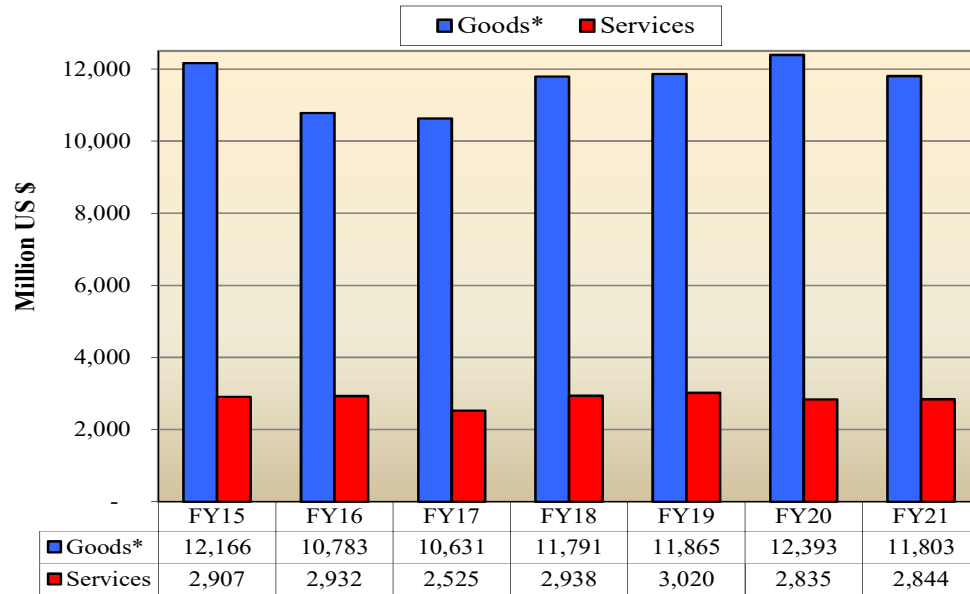
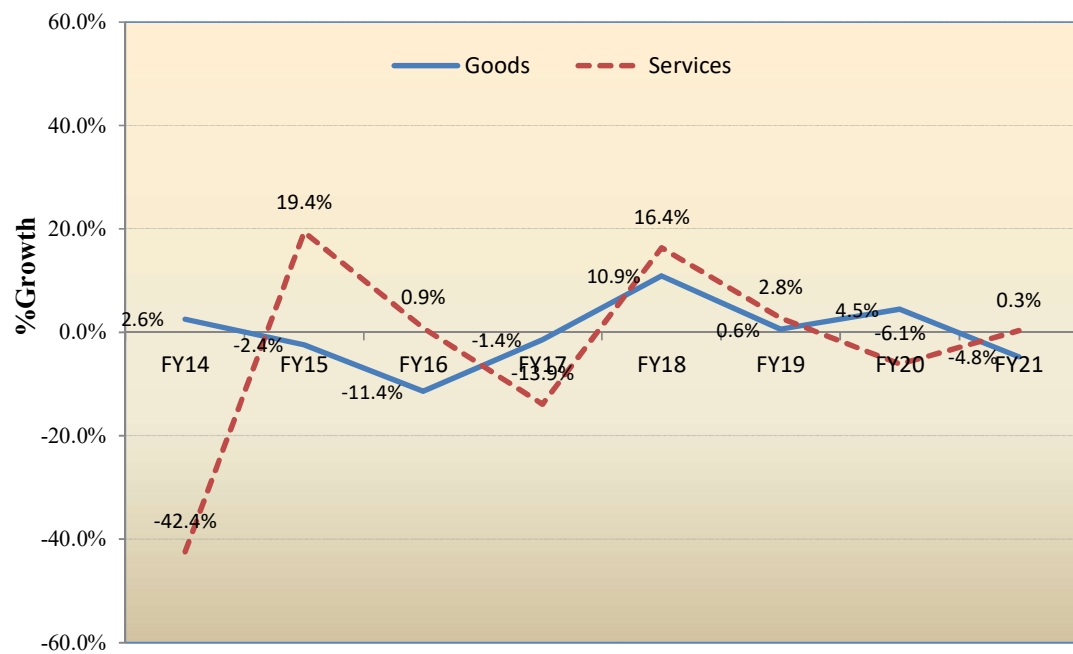


Figure 2. Growth in Export of Goods and Services during Jul-Dec

Figure 3: Percent Share of Major Commodity Groups in Export Receipts (Banks) of Goods

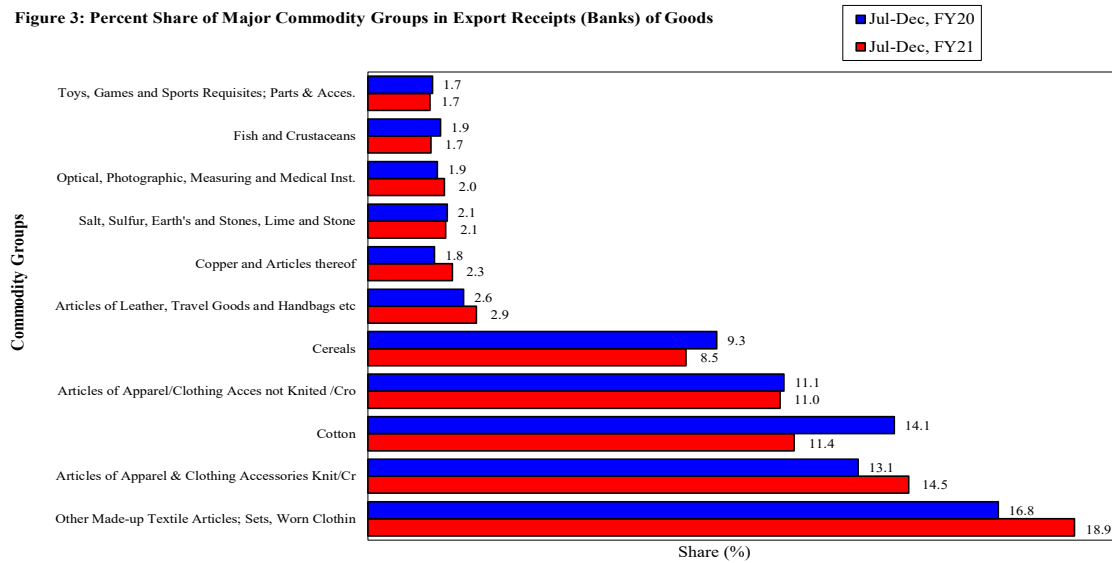


Figure 4: Export of Services

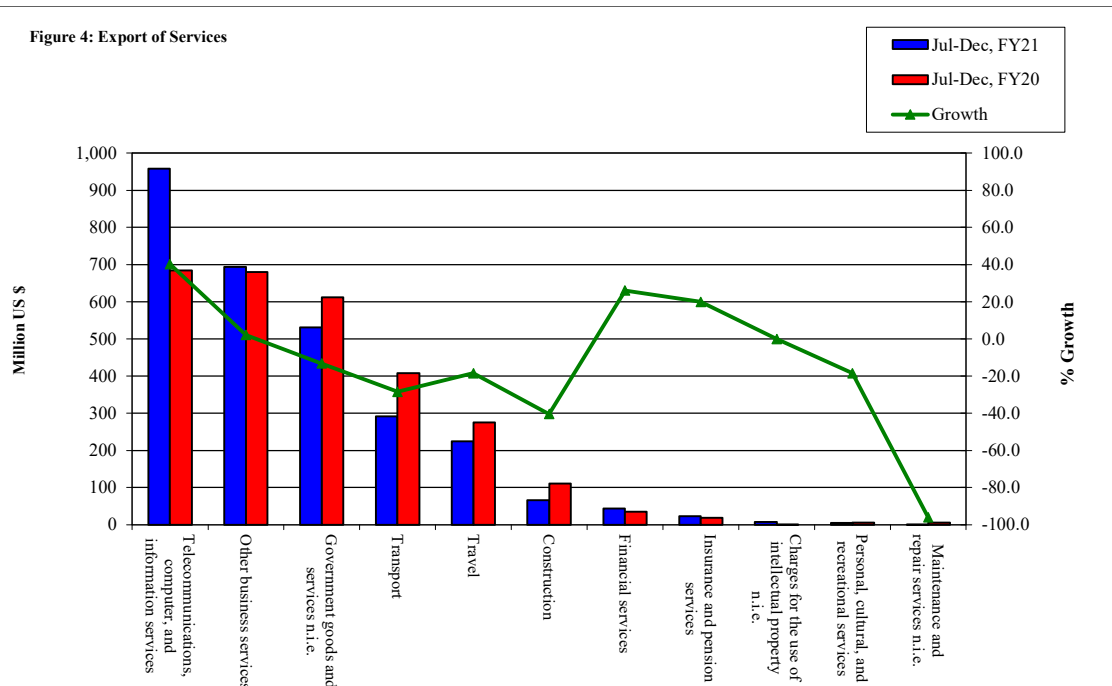

Figure 5: Percent Share of Major Countries in Export Receipts (Banks) of Goods during Jul-Dec, FY21

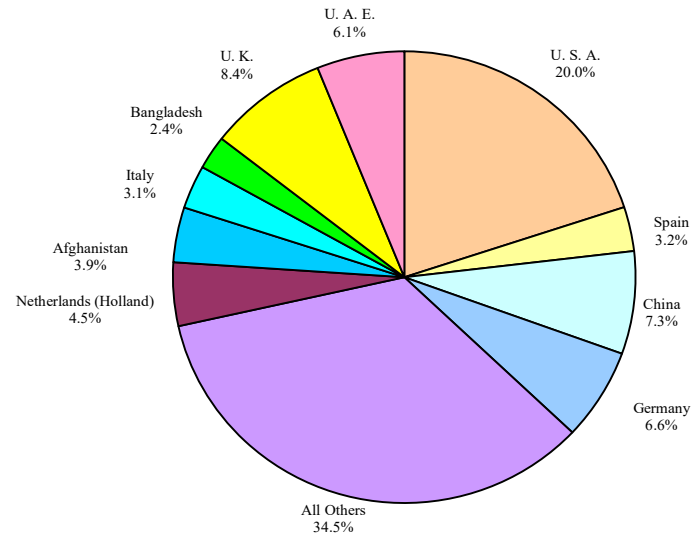


Figure 6: Percent Share of Major Countries in Export of Services during Jul-Dec, FY21

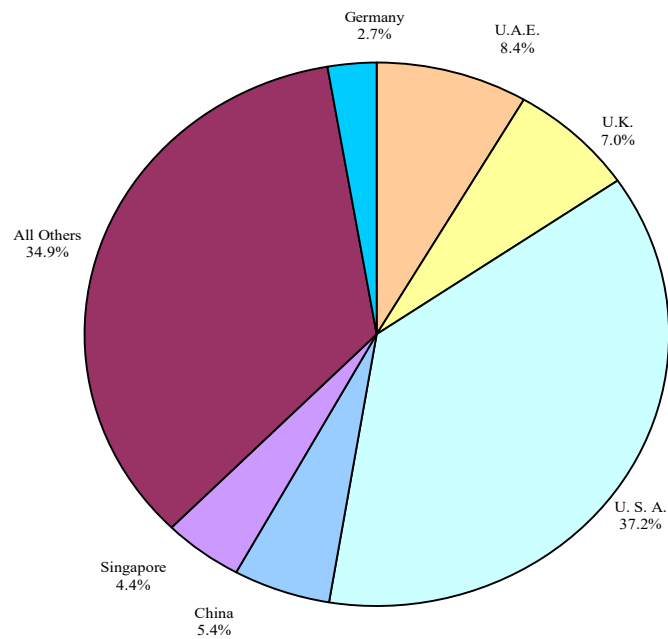


Figure 7: Annual Export of Goods & Services from FY09 to FY20

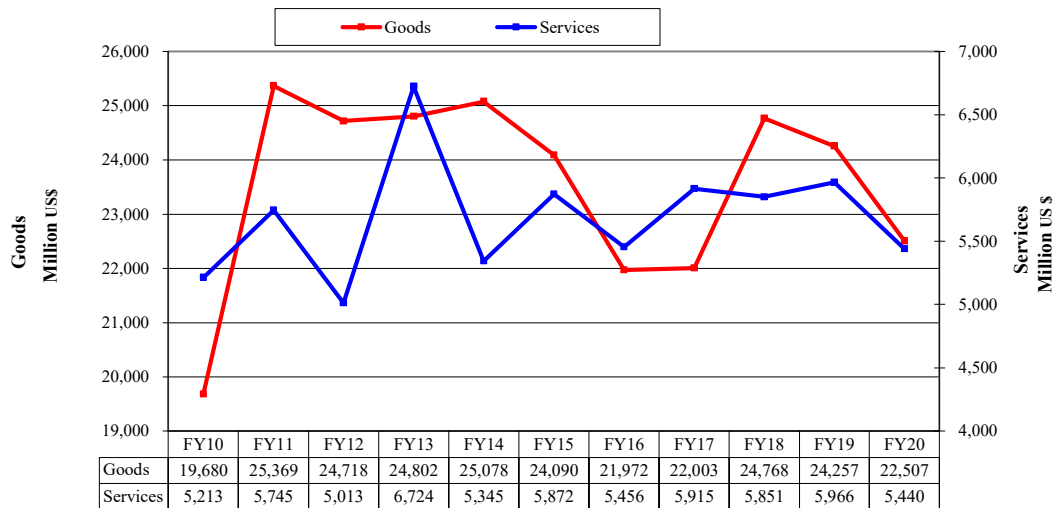


Figure 8: Monthly Export of Goods & Services

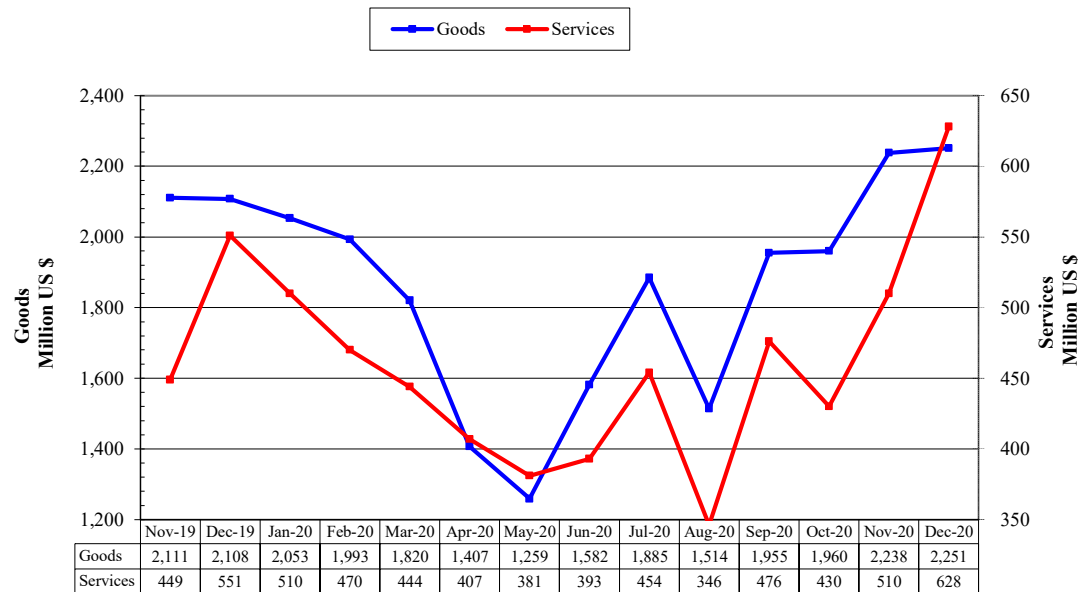
